## CHRIST'S GIFT AND OUR RESPONSE

"Who gave Himself for us, that He might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto Himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works." Titus 2:14.

People are considered rude or worse who fail to respond to the gifts of their friends. Good taste requires of us that we say, "thank-you," when something is given us. The greatest of all gifts was a divine gift made to

unworthy human beings--it was God's gift of His Son and the Son's gift of Himself. Father and Son were partners in this gift, but our text speaks only of the Son's gift. He gave Himself. There are three thoughts here: Bestowment--Christ gave Himself for us; Emancipation--Christ redeemed us from all iniquity; Acquisition --Christ purified unto Himself a people for His possession to

be zealous of good works.

I. The Great Self-Bestowment. He gave Himself. All that Christ is worth the believer has. Nothing in ourselves, we are everything in Him. The righteousness we have is His; the holiness we have is His; the redemption we have is His. Therefore, who can lay anything to our charge.

A. Giving is the real and natural expression of love.

He loved us and gave Himself for us. No love without giving.

B. The greatest giving is to give self. Greatest example of human love is for a man to lay down his life for his friends, "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends." John 15:13. We know what it is for benefactors and well-wishers and enthusiasts of all sorts to give themselves up for some cause, or for some person who appeals to their heart. The one noble thing about the devilish trade of war is that we can see men flinging their lives away gladly in the thrill of devotion to a cause or person. Suicide squads. Many times have we heard of the Swiss soldiers who gathered spears of the enemy into a sheaf and pointed them at his breast so that a path forward might be made for his comrades to victory. In a happy home you find happy husbands and devoted wives giving themselves for the happiness of each other.

C. But the greatest of all giving was Christ giving Himself for us. One man who willed to be man. Not true of others. We had absolutely nothing to do in the matter of our existence or the conditions under which we entered into existence. We had no choice of whether our parents would be white or black, rich or poor, ignorant or learned. Christ was the only child who chose His mother. He chose to be a man that He might give Himself for other men. Blessed is the man who can say, He loved me and gave Himself for me.

II. The Great Emancipation, that he might redeem us from all iniquity. Here is the purpose of giving Himself. He gave in order to redeem. Christ did not throw His life away--His life was a ransom for other lives. Christ did not waste His blood, He purchased a mighty host of people for His own possession. The word redeem suggest the image of a slave set free by the payment of a ransom price.

A. Sinners are in bondage to iniquity--tied hand and foot by cords of iniquity, in the toils of the law of God, without defense and on way to the prison of hell. The sinners deepest need is an Emancipator. Lincoln is known as the emancipator of negro slaves, but Christ is Emancipator of sinful men from a condition a thousand fold more desperate and dangerous.

B. Emancipation is two-fold. We are redeemed from the guilt of sin by the great sacrifice of Christ on the cross; we are emancipated from the power of sin by His presence in us. Why is the devil so much like a pawn-broker? Because he keeps all that is not redeemed.

C. Men do not know their need of redemption. People of our Lords day said, "We were never in bondage to any man." But Christ said He that doeth sin is the slave of sin. The worst slavery is to be a slave of sin and Satan. Various forms of this slavery: drink, swearing, adultery, unbelief, bad temper, etc. But men do not realize their slavery. If they did they would be alarmed. I read the story of an author in the last century who was put into prison and who pleased himself by twisting flowers around the bars of his cell and making believe he was a free man in a palace. Men are still fooling themselves into thinking they are free, or that they can break the cords of iniquity and free themselves.

III. The Great Acquisition, that He might purify unto Himself a people for His own possession, zealous of good works. Christ gave Himself for us that He might possess us. In giving Himself, He bought us. We are not our own; we have been bought with a price. He loved us that we might love Him. He has strange power for making men love Him. He gave Himself for me that I might give myself to Him. The only reward He wants for His love is our love in return. In the commerce of love nothing but a heart can buy a heart, nothing but a heart can pay for a heart.

Love for Christ will make us zealous of good works. Saul of Tarsus was a blasphemer and persecutor, but he fell in love with Christ and became rich in good works. The Bible says that she that liveth in pleasure is dead while she liveth. According to this there are a lot of animated corpses running around today.

Tradition: When apostle John was too feeble to walk and to old to talk much, he would have them carry him into the Lords house every Lords Day to say nothing more than this; "Little children love one another." This is the same John who wrote; "If a man say, I love God and hateth his brother, he is a liar: for he that loveth not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he

love God whom he hath not seen.?"

Love for Christ makes me want to honor Him, and love for other children of God makes me want to have fellowship with them in working for Christ. A church is a group of children liking after their fathers business. A church is a body of Christ with the various members functioning for the building up of itself in love. A church is a group of salesmen advertising the Gospel of Christ.

As a Christian I have some light that I must let shine. The place for the light is on the candlestick, and the candlestick is a church. A church is a group of believers united in the faith of what Christ commanded. A church is a group of redeemed and regenerated sinners working for the salvation of other sinners.
